

CITY OF NEW AUBURN

Ordinance No. 400

An ordinance regulating parking of vehicles and other objects on the streets and regulating truck routes within the city limits of the City of New Auburn

This municipality does ordain as follows:

Section 1. General Parking Requirements

Subdivision 1. No person shall park or let stand a vehicle, whether attended or unattended, upon any street in the City of New Auburn that has been posted.

Subdivision 2. No person shall place or leave any property or other article, except a vehicle on any street in the City of New Auburn.

Section 2. Restricted Parking During Snow Season

Subdivision 1. From November 1st through April 15th annually, parking on any city streets within the city limits of the City of New Auburn is prohibited from 2:00 a.m. through 7:00 a.m.

Subdivision 2. No person shall stop, stand, or park any vehicle upon any public street of the City of New Auburn when such street is to be plowed for snow and in which the vehicle was plowed around and has not been removed from its location, or which has been re-parked at a location which has not been plowed full-width and prevents plowing on said street full-width. The vehicle may be tagged by law enforcement officials, towed and impounded for which there are additional charges levied at the owner's expense that must be paid before the vehicle is released. This applies to any snowfall which is 2 inches or greater.

Section 3. Regulating truck routes

. All truck and tractors/ trailers must follow designated truck routes through the city limits of the City of New Auburn.

Section 4. Regulating the Parking of Semi Trucks in Residential Areas

Subdivision 1. It is unlawful to park a semi trailer, truck tractor, or the combination thereof, other than a truck with 6,000 pounds gross axel weight or less, or any vehicle design, used or maintain for towing other vehicles or equipment upon any street, alley, city right of way, private driveways or upon any public property which is within an area zoned as residential, except for the purpose of unloading or loading actively taking place and with the exception of property that is off a designated truck route .

Exceptions will be made for semi tractors from November 1st, 2009 to April 15th, 2010 and November 1st, 2010 to April 15th, 2011, to drive to and from the owner's property to park the tractor in the owner's driveway or garage only. They must use their private driveway only and are not allowed to park on the lawn anywhere.

After April 15, 2011 semi tractors shall be allowed to be driven to and from the owner's property to park the tractor in the owner's driveway or garage only. They must use their private driveway only and are not allowed to park on the lawn anywhere.

Subdivision 2. It is unlawful to park any vehicle or equipment on city streets with a gross weight of 4,000 pounds or more for more than 2 hours except for the purpose of unloading or loading actively taking place.

Weight examples but not limited to
Class C Motor Home weight 11,000 pounds
Class A Motor Home weight 20,000 pounds
5th Wheel Camper weight 9,100 pounds
Hitch Camper weight 5,100 pounds
Truck Tractor weight 12,000 pounds plus

Section 5. Regulating the Parking of Semi Trucks in Commercial Areas

There shall be no parking of semi tractors/trailers on either side of CSAH #29, also know as 8th Ave, between 3rd street and 4th street from 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. every day of the week.

Section 6. Exceptions

Subdivision 1. All emergency vehicles and emergency personnel responding to an emergency will be exempt from the parking restrictions.

Subdivision 2. Exceptions to driving on non posted truck routes are:

1. buses picking up or dropping off people
2. garbage trucks providing a service
3. the New Auburn township grader to enter and exit only
4. all recreation vehicles to enter and exit only
5. Any vehicle that is a standard manufactured passenger vehicle or a manufactured light duty pickup truck or van rated at one ton or less

Section 7. Penalties

Subdivision 1. Violation of this ordinance shall be considered a misdemeanor and upon conviction may be punished by the maximum penalty allowed by Minnesota law for a misdemeanor.

Subdivision 2. Authority to remove vehicles. Any vehicle, wherever found, in violation of this or other city ordinance or the laws of the State of Minnesota, is declared to be a nuisance. Any police officer or other duly authorized person may order the vehicle to be tagged, towed and

impounded for which there additional charges are levied at the owner's expense that must be paid before the vehicle is released.

Subdivision 3. Any court costs, legal fees and administrative fees will be paid by the vehicle's owner.

Section 8. Repeal

The following ordinances are hereby repealed:

Ordinance number 58 An ordinance limiting parking of semi-tractors and trailers

Ordinance number 86 An ordinance regulating parking on streets and providing for penalties for violation thereof

Section 9. Effective date of ordinance

This ordinance shall become effective upon adoption and publication.
